

Review Women's 81kg

- Lidia Valentin Perez (ESP) won the gold medal in the Snatch and the Total, claiming her fourth and fifth world title after she had already won all three events in the 75kg in 2017. She was already the only Spanish weightlifter to have won world titles.
- Valentin Perez also claimed the bronze medal in the Clean & Jerk, lifting her total tally to 10 world championship medals. All other Spanish female athletes have claimed 11 weightlifting world championship medals combined (G0-S3-B8).
- On Friday 2 November Josue Brachi (ESP) claimed a medal in the men's Snatch 55kg. With Valentin Perez winning her three medals today, Spain equalled its record tally of four medals at a single edition of the world championships, set in 2017.
- Darya Naumava (BLR) won the gold medal in the Clean & Jerk, the silver medal in the Total and the bronze medal in the Snatch. She is the first woman from Belarus to claim three medals at a single edition of the world championship since Nastassia Novikava won two gold medals and a silver medal in the 58kg in 2011.
- Tamara Yajaira Salazar Arce (ECU) claimed the silver medal in the Clean & Jerk and the bronze medal in the Total, the third and fourth medal for Ecuador at the 2018 world championships. Only in 2017 (5) Ecuador claimed more medals in women's events.
